Americans dually eligible for Medicare and Medicaid who choose Medicare Advantage tend to be <u>older</u>, <u>sicker</u>, <u>and more racially and ethnically diverse</u> than those who choose traditional Medicare.

A person's health is influenced by many non-medical factors, called "social determinants of health" – where a person lives, grows, learns, and works. Medicare Advantage works to tackle social barriers to good health through supplemental benefits like:



Expanded access to telehealth services



Delivering in-home support services



Transportation for health care appointments and non-medical needs



Home delivery of essential supplies like prescription drugs and groceries



Services for eligible enrollees that address social isolation like club memberships and family counseling



Benefits that meet specific health care needs, such as vision, hearing, dental and fitness benefits
