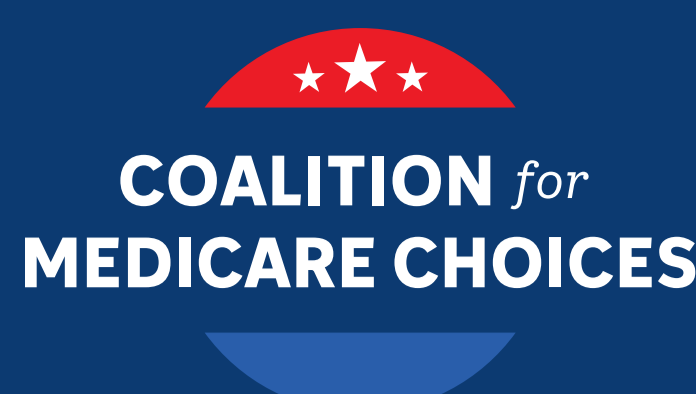
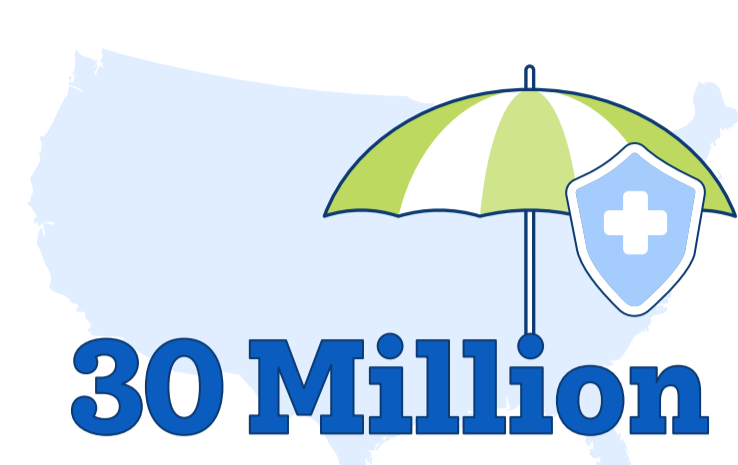

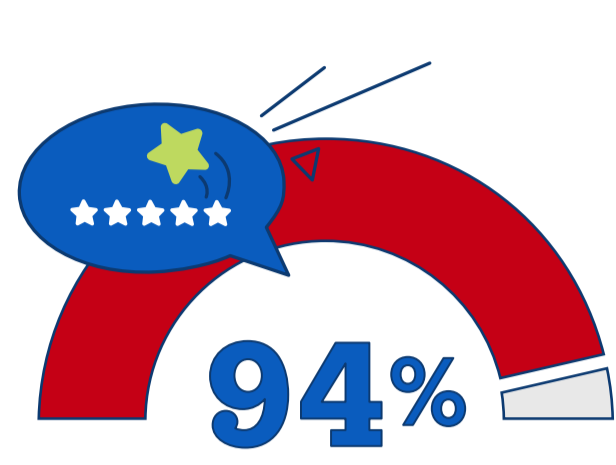


## DELIVERING for Seniors

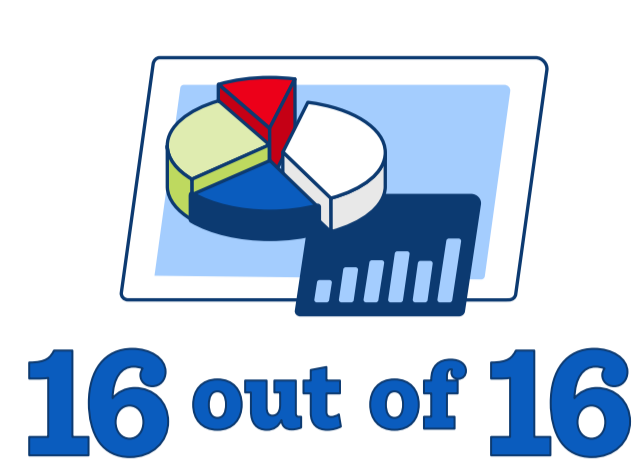

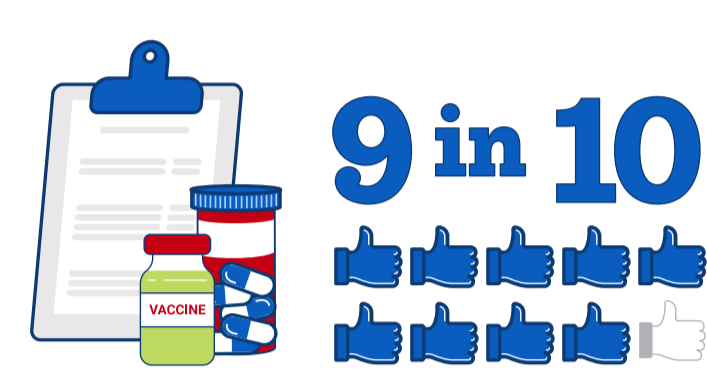
Over **30 million Americans** choose Medicare Advantage for their coverage and care.



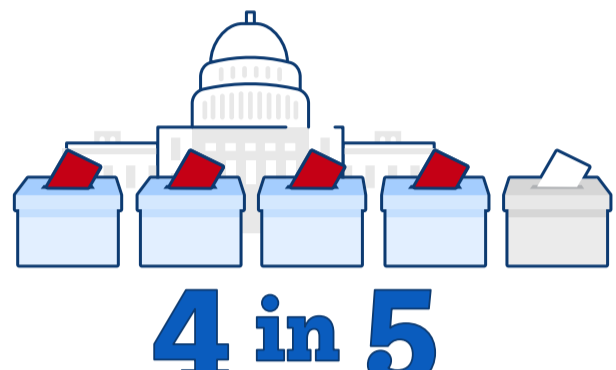
**94%** of senior voters with Medicare Advantage are satisfied with their coverage.

**4 in 5** senior voters say it is important for the federal government and the Biden Administration to protect funding for Medicare Advantage.



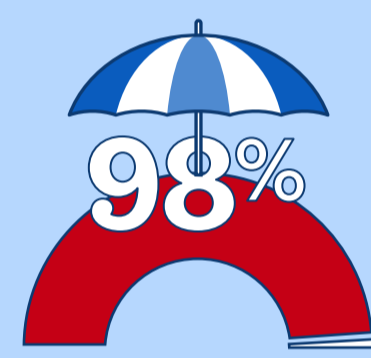
**3 in 4** senior voters with Medicare Advantage are concerned about cuts to their benefits due to rising inflation rates.

## SAVING Money for Americans

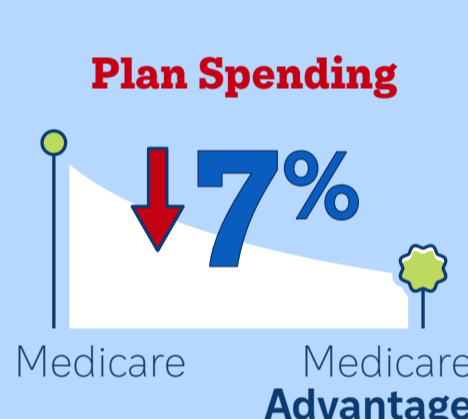
Medicare Advantage provides affordable coverage with additional benefits that original Medicare doesn't cover. And competition in the Medicare Advantage space drives low premiums and caps on annual out-of-pocket costs.



The average monthly Medicare Advantage premium for 2023 is **\$18**.



**98%** of Medicare-eligible Americans have access to a zero-premium Medicare Advantage plan with drug coverage.

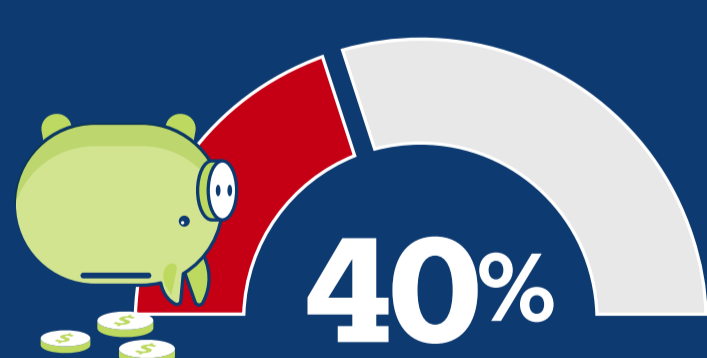


**7%** less spending on Medicare Advantage plans compared to original Medicare on an apples-to-apples basis, based on 2019 data.

### Diverse American Communities

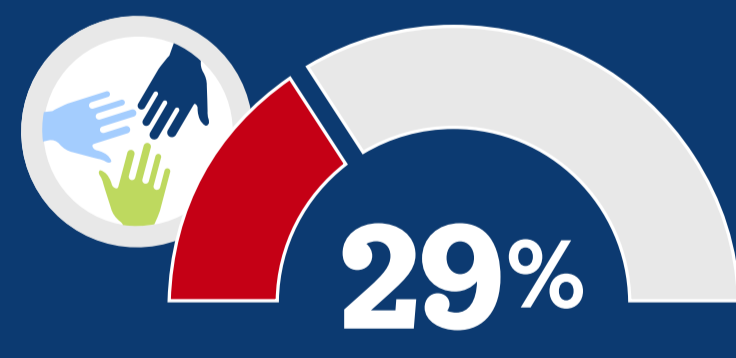

**40%** of Americans choosing Medicare Advantage make less than \$25,000 a year.

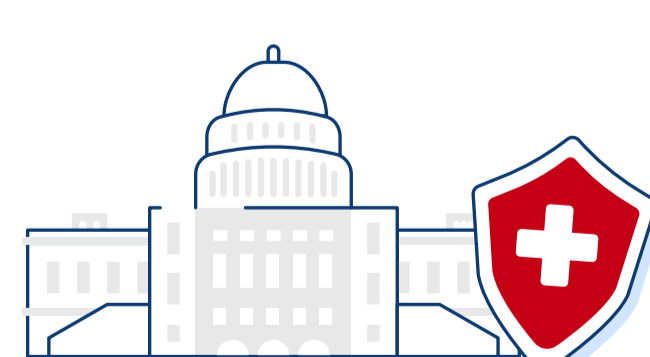


**3.7 million** rural Americans served by Medicare Advantage. That's up from 3.2 million in 2020.
